


Values, Cultures and Behavior: (the study of human values) 1980 - 2015

1980 - Hofstede, *Cultural Consequences*: 4 axes


- 1 - individualism - collectivism

1986 - Basáñez, *Trust-Work-Autonomy*: 3 axes



1993 - Basáñez, *Cultural Map, Religions*: 2 axes



1987 - Schwartz, *Psychological Structure: 4 axes*




Compass rose








FIGURE 4.7. Generational differences on cultural map. Each arrow runs from oldest to youngest age group.

Axiological Cube: Six Walls (Schwartz terminology)




35 years of Cultural Axiology's development
